

Johnson Dominates in Vintage Drag Racing Association National Event.

On August 1st, Wes Johnson was able to put both of his Flat Head powered dragsters into the finals of the Flathead/Inline class at Bandimere Speedway during their ALL FORD DAY event. Between the two cars they put away every competitor they faced. Qualifying was called off after two passes were made on Saturday due to weather. Sunday was a beautiful day for drag racing and the Annual All Ford Car Show. One more qualifying pass was allowed on Sunday Morning. Driver, and son Mark, qualified #2 and cousin Tom Waring qualified #7. This was the first time that Wes has ever put two cars in the finals. He has accomplished putting both into the semi finals three times. Tom ran three thousands of a second off his dial-in to beat Mark who broke out (ran too fast) in the finals. This was the second time Tom has won this National event in Wes' 1962 front engine dragster. Mark is currently the points leader in their class. Plans are to have the championship car on display at Charlie Palmer's seminar on Saturday August 28th.

Wes Johnson wins First and Second Place at Flathead/Inline Nationals at Bandimere Speedway with his three-car team. August 1, 2021

After many years of drag racing, both in and out of the cars, Wes Johnson has pulled off a first in his racing career. His team won First and Second Place at the VDRA Flathead/Inliners Nationals meet at Bandimere Speedway. Tom Waring, Wes's cousin and driver of the Black 1962 dragster pulled off the victory after a day of consistent driving. Mark Johnson, Wes's son, driving the Red 1988 Dragster had a winning day, coming home with respectable second after a very close loss to Tom in the final. Tom had a dial-in time of 12.90 in the final and crossed the finish line at 12.905, just 5/1000 of a second over his dial-in. He had that kind of consistency all day long. They had a photo finish in the last race, with Mark breaking out of his dial-in time causing a loss. Mark said later. "If I have to lose the race I want it to be because I went too fast" Both Tom and Mark worked their way through a 14 car field of Flatheads and Inline cars which brought them to the final. Wes's grandson John, driving his inline 6 Maverick, broke out, and lost in the first round to his Dad, Mark. My observation was that the family team won the day based on preparation and execution.

Their next race will be Saturday August 21, 2021 at Julesberg, the oldest continuously operating NHRA track in America.





Patrol hats from everywhere, badges from all the years. So much to look at it was hard to take it all in that was there. I think everyone had a good time which made it a very enjoyable morning we sit around and talked then people started to leave.

Seminar Chairman's Report September 2021

State Patrol Seminar Saturday July 24, 2021

The Early Ford V8 Club was fortunate enough to be the first group to tour The Colorado State Patrol Museum at Camp George West. For many of the forty in attendance, there was more to see and learn than we expected. We saw restored patrol cars – Mustangs and Camaros, and a 1970 Plymouth Fury that the museum purchased from the family of the Patrolman who drove the car on patrol. We also saw the 1935 Ford Tudor Sedan which was restored as a replica Courtesy Patrol Car. More on the cars later.

After coffee and donuts we gathered around so I could introduce our host, Lt. Col. Barry Bratt, the driving force behind the restoration of the patrol cars and the layout of the museum. When I scheduled the tour with Barry he asked if we could clean up his existing tool kit display, which had Model T wrenches, Model A wrenches and one '35 wrench, all mounted on a used cabinet door. After Barry's introduction, we presented him with the correct tool kit for the '35 Ford. The display we donated ended up looking pretty good as a result of help from the following members:

Nick Morstad – Donated pliers.

Bernie Arellano - Donated screwdriver.

Ed Rockwell – Donated grease gun.

Steve Kennedy – An expert on tools, Steve identified the correct tools required for the '35 kit, researched available tools on-line, went to swap meets and local vintage shops and then provided tools from his extensive Ford tool collection. Thanks Steve. By the way, he made the reproduction tool pouch and is co-authoring a book on Jaguar Tools. If you want to know about Ford tools, he can probably help.

Following the tool kit presentation we all posed for a group picture, then Barry began his tour. Barry pointed out that the Mustangs, Camaros and the Fury were all retired patrol cars. Barry personally restored, including paint, the Camaros in his garage at home. He's a car guy like all of us. When the 1970 Plymouth Fury was retired, Patrolman Lou Baughman purchased his former patrol car for personal use. His family used it for many years then parked it when it developed an expensive engine problem. Barry learned that the Fury was stored in a barn and contacted Lou who agreed to sell it to the museum. The museum is not funded by the Colorado State Patrol, but by donations and volunteers. At the time there were 600 Patrolman in Colorado, so they each donated \$1 and the Fury was purchased for \$600. Barry and the Patrolmen used their spare time to do all the mechanical work and Hagerty Insurance funded the body and paint work. Bill Roushey, the Fleet Manager for Hagerty, attended our seminar, driving his beautiful mid-engine Lotus Europa, which he restored.

Barry explained to us that in 1935 the number of accidents and fatalities from motor vehicles was on a steep rise due to faster cars and more of them. There was no state wide traffic enforcement so the Colorado Legislature created the Colorado Courtesy Patrol, with the name changing to the Colorado State Patrol in 1945. The '35 Ford commemorates the start of the Colorado Courtesy Patrol. The Ford has been restored twice with the Hi-Country Regional Group participating in one of those restorations. The available history on that work is somewhat vague. It does appear that Dreith Auto Body did the paint that we see on the car now. Barry has worked weekends and used vacation days to do the restorations and set up the museum displays, and he also trailers the cars to shows and events, and wins trophies. Barry found the numerous '35 Ford trophies, which it has won over the years, in storage.

In addition to the cars, the museum displays equipment used in patrol cars – sirens, lights, radar, radios and more. There is an extensive display of license plates, photos of patrol cars through the years, uniforms, cameras, hats, records and promotional literature. Barry had a current working patrol car brought over for viewing. It is capable of 150 mph.
