
September Presidents Message





Hood Springs by Arnel Kimmett

If you have a 52-54 Ford or Mercury car and have been having problems with opening the hood, or keeping it up after it has been raised, new springs may be what you need. For the past couple of years I have been searching for new springs for my 53 Merc. The hood would not stay up properly and switching to other used ones did not help. (For you skeptics yes, an old broom handle does the job but that gets to be a pain after a while).

I have now come across a firm that makes new ones. Several people have asked me for contact info and it is Spotlite Kustom, located in CA. 909-724-9235, or website, Spotlitekustomaccesssories.com. \$60 for the 4 springs, 2 flat spiral and 2 long extension. After buying and installing new ones from them the hood works perfect, just like it should.

Now part 2. OK, you bought new springs---how in the hell to you put them on. First, prop up the hood with the above mentioned old broom handle. Next place some old rags under the back corners of the hood in case it decides to slide into the cowl in removing the old springs. Work on one side of the hood at a time.

Changing the flat springs is easy, just a little armstrong and they twist off the hood hinge tab. Same with installing the new ones back onto the tab. Now to the long extension springs. Ohhh, you say you can't install the new ones because there is no way you can armstrong them? Trying to pry them on with a screwdriver doesn't seem to work either as the new ones are much stiffer than the old worn out ones. Now you realize the springs will need to be stretched another way, but how? I figured stretching the springs would require either mechanical or hydraulic help. One method that worked for me was using a floor jack. Simply hook one of the spring eyes in the front wheel jack axle and the other eye in the edge of the lifting cup. Stretch it only enough to snugly place pennies (everyone has a jar full of these) up both sides of the spring, bottom to top. Release the jack tension and you are now holding a stretched spring with the pennies very tight in the coils. It may take a little maneuvering but it will now fit in the hinge. Place a shop towel directly under the spring and slowly lower the hood. The spring will stretch a little more and the pennies will fall out, onto the towel for easy pickup. Your hood will work as new.


