
This month's cover photo by Eddie is of our old Fords that attended the Veterans Day observance at Ft. Logan last year.



# November Columbia Seminar


# Saturday November 5, 2022 will be the Columbia Seminar at Charlie and Pat Palmer's place, 980 Ulysses St Golden 80401.




