

November 11th Tour Veterans Day at Fort Logan By Tom Webb

It's one of my families' favorite dining places, so I like to share it with my friends. It's located at the Northgate of Fort Logan, one half block east of the long-gone Ft. Logan Train Depot. The "Uncle Sam" train would bring in the troops of Soldiers from Denver's Union Station. Many detoured here before arrival for duty. The Fort was active from 1889 to 1959. The train platform for the arrivals and departures still exists across the street from Roy Monaghan's business, 130 years later.

We always have interesting story telling of Veteran's experiences. Bernie Arellano's father started his Army life at Ft. Logan (1940) and was separated there in 1945.
