A new Mustang II front suspension was installed to accommodate the new power train which includes a multi-port fuel injected 347 Stroker backed by a 4r70w Overdrive transmission, getting the power to the ground is a triangulated 4-link narrowed Ford 9 inch rear end with a 3.89 gears.
































June Seminar at Jay's Garage

July Tour


Our July Tour will be Sunday, July 21, 2024 at the Littleton Museum, 6028 South Gallup St., Littleton, CO 80120.
