July Tour


Our July Tour will be Sunday, July 21, 2024 at the Littleton Museum, 6028 South Gallup St., Littleton, CO 80120.



An Easy Way to Test for Spark

This was new to me, but I asked my brother about an easy way for one person to check an electrical issue - Betty Ford (our '35 Ford roadster) would not start. I tried several different times with no success. There was absolutely no hint of gas being ignited.

I wanted to check if the spark plugs were sparking. I had seen an inductive spark tester that I liked the looks of, but it was out of stock everywhere except for a few dubious places that had marked the price up. With it, the test lights would stay lit until you reset it. Perfect for a one-person operation.

My brother suggested using a timing light to check the spark. Since most timing lights require 12 volts and Betty still has a 6-volt system, I found a self-contained one that uses two D-cell batteries. The cord was also long enough for me operate it from the cockpit while I cranked the engine.

It worked great. The light flashed as I turned the engine over, so the electrical side was working.

About that time Betty started...she evidently just wanted me to spend some more money on her.

Anyway, you two probably knew about the timing light approach but thought I would pass my brother's idea along for future reference.
