**Remembrances:** Patti provided an update on current club members with health issues.


**Program:** Lou Mraz, provided the program with photos of a past V8 tour in 2016.



#### A DREAM COME TRUE

For so many years, we wanted a Tucker. The dream came to fruition in October of 2006. A little bit of history about Tucker. There were only 51 Tuckers manufactured. Of those only 47 now exist. Most are in museums around the

country and there are about 15-16 in private ownership. We bought #17 from Fred Hunter. Fred had completely restored #17 to its "off the line perfection."

But the story of #17 goes way back. It was sold to a Brazilian distributor in 1948. For a reason no one knows it was returned to the factory after only a month and many improvements were made including the installation of a Y1 transmission. A series of owners



owned the car for the next 20 or so years. One of the last owners started to restore #17 and completely disassembled the car, sandblasted it to bare metal and let it sit under a shed for several years. Bill Hamlin, who was a Tucker expert, found and bought the car in 1971. He took the car and boxes of parts to his home in California. After assessing what he had, he thought that the car should be used as a parts car because of its insanely poor condition. But along came Steve Nicas who said," no, no, I want to buy it." It was agreed Mr. Hamlin would get the engine running. Bill got the car running and Steve redid the interior and painted #17 in a burnt orange color. He showed it at several shows around the California and Nevada area. Eventually, #17 ended up in the San Diego Museum. Mr. Nicas died and his son tried to sell the car at auction, but was unsuccessful. We heard about #17 being for sale and traveled to California to look at it. It was in such bad shape and there was so much Bondo. The price was a whopping \$250,000. We decided it was more than we wanted to tackle. Several months later we were attending a Muntz

Jet meet along with Fred Hunter who we had become friends with a few years earlier. Fred announced that he had bought a Tucker for \$250,000 and, of course, we knew which Tucker he had bought. Fred took the next 3 years (approximately 2003 to 2006) to restore #17 back to its original glory. It was painted back to the original color of green, and it was refurbished from top to bottom. Unfortunately, just as Fred was finishing the car, he was dying from cancer. He did get to take #17 to a Tucker meet, but died shortly thereafter. We then saw an ad in Hemmings for a Tucker and realized it was #17 that Fred had bought and restored.



To make a long story short, we acquired the car in October of 2006 and brought it home. We were beside ourselves with joy because we had waited probably 30 years to buy a Tucker. We had many car clubs come to visit and Preston as we lovingly named #17 was taken to concourses around the country (Amelia Island, Lake Mirror to name a few). Best of Show trophies were won at several shows. In 2018, we were invited to Pebble Beach where 13 Tuckers were on display. It was probably the thrill of a lifetime to show "Preston" at Pebble Beach.

Earlier this year, we determined that we needed to transfer ownership to someone else to take care of our beloved Preston. #17 was donated to the University of Nebraska at Kearney where we attended college and the University sold Preston to the Dream Car Collection in Manhattan, KS. The money that was paid for #17 by The Dream Car Collection went to our scholarship fund at the University for a total of approximately 57 scholarships. We were thrilled to see #17 go to that collection. The Dream Car Collection is a fantastic collection, and they display their cars so well. It was a thrill to see it displayed there. If you wish to view the Reveal Party, you can go to YouTube and search for "1948 Tucker #1017 Reveal Party" and watch the reveal. So, this is the end of an era for us in our ownership of #17. We miss the car every day, but now it is in great hands.

A final note: Eileen was the only one who ever drove #17 during our ownership.
