Photos of Eddie's '40 are in the last V8 Times magazine. He won the 1st in class and longest distance awards.
































2024 Turkey Trot Around the Golden/Arvada Area

mitted in writing to a committee member. Any active, paid, V-8 club member is eligible to receive the award.




Note: Members can be nominated by either a club member or a committee member, **BUT** it is not entirely up to the committee to nominate someone for the award.
